- The unit of competency CPCCLDG3001A - License to perform dogging.

This unit requires the operator to be able plan the work, slinging techniques, directing the crane operator in the movement of the load when the load is out of view of the crane.

We anticipate that this training and assessment will help to provide safer work practices in the workplace creating a safer work environment for all personnel.

Application for Licence

A person who has been issued with a Statement of Attainment for performing high risk work must apply to the licensing authority within 60 days of the date that the Statement of Attainment was issued. Failure to do so may result in the licensing authority requiring the applicant to be reassessed.

The application must be made in a manner and form determined by the licensing authority, and must be accompanied by:

- Proof of identity and age of the applicant.
- A Statement of Attainment relating to the class of high risk work applied for and issued by an RTO not more than 60 days before the date of the application.
- A declaration whether the application has had a licence for any class of high risk work cancelled or suspended by a licensing authority in the past five years.
- The fee required by the licensing authority.

Pre-requisites – There are no pre –requisites or co-requisites for this course
