

TLILIC908A License to operate a slewing mobile crane (up to 60 tonnes)

Our Aims

- To provide you with the required knowledge and skills to operate a slewing mobile crane (up to 60 tonnes) for licensing purposes. It encompasses the requirement for the up to 20 tonnes license.

About the course

This unit requires the operator to be able plan the work, conduct routine checks, set up crane, transfer loads, mobile loads and shut down and secure the crane.

This unit is based on the requirements of the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work.

We anticipate that this training and assessment will help to provide safer work practices in the workplace creating a safer work environment for all personnel.

Assessment:

You will be assessed against the requirements of the relevant nationally endorsed unit. To achieve competency you must be able to demonstrate that:

- a. Have the relevant underpinning knowledge and can safely perform the high risk work under realistic workplace conditions.
- b. Use the English language at a level that enables the safe performance of high risk work as specified in the competency standard.

Learning and assessment activities will be conducted by assessors using a range of evidence gathering techniques throughout the course, including written and practical demonstrations. Your trainer will provide you with any support you may require with your assessments throughout your training.

CE Training will conduct formal WorkCover Accredited Licencing Assessments to National Accredited WorkCover Assessments Instruments by a WorkCover NSW Accredited Assessor for a National Licence to Perform High Risk Work.

Application for a licence:

The application must be made in a manner and form determined by the licensing authority, and must be accompanied by:

- a. Proof of identity and age of the applicant
- b. A Statement of Attainment relating to the class of high risk work applies for and issued by an RTO not more than 60 days before the date of the application.
- c. A declaration whether the application has had a licence for any class of high risk work cancelled or suspended by a licensing authority in the past five years.
- d. The fee required by the licensing authority.

Outcomes

Successful candidates will receive a statement of attainment in TLILIC908A – License to operate a slewing mobile crane (up to 60 tonnes).

Pathways- After successful completion of this statement of attainment you may decide to enroll in other courses from the TLI Training Package. Please ask one of our friendly staff for further information
